Dear Members and Friends,

The change in the weather has been especially dramatic this year. For some weeks my daily routine has included checking the weather forecasts to determine which nights might bring freezing temperatures and to cover up outdoor plants accordingly. With the warmer temperatures and signs of spring all around, I am reminded that Holy Week and Easter are just a few weeks away. As Christians, we give thanks to God for the beauty of creation, the warmth of spring, and the wonder of new life in nature. We also remember that nature mirrors God's promise of re-creation and new life through Christ. As Holy Scripture reminds us, "If anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation. The past is finished and gone. All things become fresh and new (II Corinthians 5.17)."

I look forward to our traditions of Holy Week here at Shelby Presbyterian:

- the palms at the beginning of Holy Week as we remember Jesus entering Jerusalem for the observance of Passover;
- the Maundy Thursday service as we recall Jesus' last supper with his disciples in the upper room, and how he washed their feet, and commanded them to love as he loved;
- the noon-day service on Good Friday with music and Scripture reading that tell of Christ's death for our sakes;
- and finally the observance of Easter.

This year the Easter Sunrise service is scheduled for 7 a.m. in the courtyard garden. The service concludes in front of the sanctuary as we gather before the flower cross, behold the rising sun, and give thanks for the Risen Son. Both the 8:30 a.m. and 11 a.m. service will be held in the sanctuary. We will be surrounded by Easter lilies, hear the beautiful anthems of our Chancel choir, and join our voices in hymns of praise. Easter is the most important time for us as Christians – the occasion when we sing praise to God for the "incredible gift" of Jesus Christ. (II Corinthians 9.15).

May this Easter season be a time of renewed hope, strength, and joy as we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

OUT OF CHAOS, HOPE

The Presbytery of Western North Carolina Mission Committee is offering a mission trip to West Virginia to help with flood recovery. The number of natural disasters seems to be overwhelming in the recent past. South Carolina, Louisiana, Eastern North Carolina, East Tennessee, and West Virginia have all experienced disasters that will take years to recover from. We have been to South Carolina twice and will be planning other trips. This spring's trip is to an area that was devastated by floods; an area that already experiences high levels of poverty. We will be working with the help of West Virginia Ministry of Advocacy & Workcamps, Inc., Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, and Ronceverte Presbyterian Church in Greenbrier County.

OVERVIEW OF THE TRIP FROM WVMAW:

WVMAW is a long term recovery agency that is an arm of the WV Presbytery disaster response. We book week long groups for long term recovery projects, and have project managers who lead and teach and keep materials on site. Generally we book Saturday to Saturday, but most groups arrive on Sunday. We are flexible in that many cannot stay the full week so you can choose how many days would work for your team. The cost is \$250 per person for the week, and we can break it down to daily working day rate. The only cost you will need to figure is transportation and food.

Dates: Sunday, April 30 - Saturday, May 6, 2017

Cost: \$250 per person for the whole week (food will be included); cost will be prorated for those staying less than the full week.

SESSION MEETING NOTES
FEBRUARY 21, 2017

The Session of Shelby Presbyterian Church met on Tuesday, February 21, 2017 at 6:30 p.m. in the back parlor of the church. In attendance were Rev. Luke Harkey, Pastor, Moderator; Elders: Joe Ogburn, Clerk of Session, Anne Langley, Jill Venable, Ellen Fletcher, Sherry Young, Kathy Wilson, Agaat Den Hertog, Doug Boyette, Paul Woodard, Brock Taylor, Robin Holland. Elders with an excused absence were: Margie McSwain, Jeff Hamilton, Lloyd Williams Jr. Also present were the following: Sandy Cheaney and Laura Carter, Co-Chairs of the Board of Deacons, Dr. Alden Sproull. Rev. Luke Harkey called the meeting to order and had the opening prayer. Joe Ogburn lit the candle and read from Psalms. Sherry Young led in singing of the Hymn. Sherry presented plans for Prayer Trios during the season of Lent. Luke Harkey led in the reciting of the affirmation of faith as printed in the agenda.

COMMUNICATIONS:

Clerk - Joe Ogburn and Ellen Fletcher reported on the recent Presbytery meeting. Sign-up list for Session devotionals and lighting the Christ Candle was circulated and following is the schedule: March-Anne Langley; April-Kathy Wilson; May-Jill Venable; June-Doug Boyette; July-Agaat Den Hertog; August-Brock Taylor; September-Ellen Fletcher; October-Sherry Young; November-Robin Holland; December-Paul Woodard. Plans are being made to identify a Church Historian. A presbytery-wide meeting to discuss the new Directory of Worship is scheduled for Tuesday, March 28, 2017.

Co-Chairs, Diaconate - Laura Carter and Sandy Cheaney reported that 27 Valentine bags were prepared by Deacons and delivered to homebound and residential members. Deacon outreach to encourage church attendance during Lent is planned.

Pastor - Luke Harkey reported on a successful blood drive on 2-21-17. Presbytery is working toward finalizing the disability request of former Associate Pastor, Rebecca Jones. A brief discussion of the Confession of 1967 was presented. Wednesday night program for 2-22-17 will be led by Marie Connelly de Palacios and will be a discussion of her role in our Guatemala Partnership. Rev. Joan Martin will preach on April 2 and April 30, 2017.

ORDER OF THE DAY:

Dr. Alden Sproull presented his experience as Chaplain and Spiritual Director. He requested use of

space within Shelby Presbyterian Church so that he can offer sessions of Spiritual Direction. A motion to allow his request was tabled pending clarification of liability insurance issues for SPC. Dr Sproull will return for the March meeting to further clarify his request.

MINUTES:

Minutes of the Session meeting of January 17, 2017 were approved.

COMMITTEES:

Finance - Jill Venable reported that the finances of the church have been looked over internally and are in order. The Finance Committee met with representatives of the Bank of the Ozarks and felt that the funds of the church are conservatively invested.

Nominating - Doug Boyette reported that the slate of nominees for Deacon and Elder has been completed and will be presented to the congregation on Sunday, March 5, 2017.

Worship and Music - Robin Holland requested approval for a revised schedule of Communion. Request was approved. A wedding request has been approved by Worship and Music Committee. Fifth Sunday activities will be discussed by the ministers of the involved churches and lay members from each church.

OLD BUSINESS:

Staffing for Youth Ministry was discussed. A short term plan was suggested and discussed. The matter will be referred to the finance, personnel, education, and youth committees combined to come to the Session meeting in March with suggestions for moving forward toward meeting the needs of youth ministry.

NEW BUSINESS:

•The following motion was made: A task force is hereby authorized to draft a policy for terms of service for members of the committees of the church. The task force will consist of the Clerk of Session, Co-Chairs of the Deacons, and the pastor. Motion was approved.

•The following motion was made regarding five-cents-a-meal offering and Souper Bowl of Caring offering: Beginning in 2018, the five-cents-a-meal offering will be collected on the first Sunday of each month except February. Motion was approved.

Luke Harkey closed the meeting with prayer.
