ORGAN RENOVATION UPDATE

The W. Zimmer and Sons pipe organ has served the congregation since 1970. After all these years of service, the organ needs urgent repairs, upgrades and updates. It still has lasting value and potential to continue for many more years. However, at this point in its life, renovations would ensure the organ continues to be a vital and even more versatile contributor to worship.

Due to the loss of employees, the Zimmer Company will not be able to perform renovations on the SPC organ in 2017. Zimmer has lost services of three of its six employees, due to major surgery, retirement, and resignation.

The project can, however, get underway in January 2018 and be finished by Easter. To firm up the place in the Zimmer work schedule and to secure equipment prices, the Finance Committee feels that it can loan funds from the Annie Duncan Fund. This is a fund used for emergency purposes. The committee often borrows from this fund in the summer when tithing is slow. The loan is conditional upon the Worship and Music Committee doing an educational/fund raising campaign. If it turns out

that they are unable to raise all the necessary funding, the Finance Committee will need to go through a formal process as laid out in the Cornerstone Fund document to access funds to replenish the Annie Duncan Fund. Finance Committee members feel it is appropriate financially to commit to the up-fit at this time.

There is currently a little over \$55,600 in the organ fund. The original estimate to complete the work was \$116,000 and will likely be \$2,000 or \$3,000 more. Donations are being accepted to repay the Annie Duncan Fund.

2008 Interview With Homer Haworth

Homer Haworth, a former choir director, was interviewed about the organ in 2008 for the church's 150th anniversary:

"The organ itself is a Zimmer Organ, bought in 1970 from a company in Charlotte that made organs throughout the southeast."

"Paul and Ruth Seal of Seal Wire Company donated a large amount of money to purchase a new pipe organ. The Arrowood family designated memorial funds given in memory of Paul Arrowood for a console, and the Schweppe family donated the chimes in memory of their son David who had been killed in a car crash while in high school."

"The committee appointed to purchase the new organ was composed of Lyndon Hobbs, Chair, Neil Johnson, Former Chair, Hugh Arrowood, R.T. LeGrand, Jack Schweppe, George Webb, Pastor, and me. Michael Arrowood consulted on the design of the organ."

About the Zimmer Company

Organ building is an intricate craft, which originated in Europe during the Middle Ages. The art and science of creating these amazing musical instruments was passed down from father to son, generation after generation. Such is the legacy of Cornel Zimmer. While Cornel will always embrace the history of organ building in his family, his current focus is on the history his company is making today and his vision of taking the craft of organ building into the future. Cornel is a fourth generation organ builder. In 1992, upon the retirement of his father, Cornel founded the Company that now bears his name and which is a continuum of the work begun in the 1890's by his great grandfather. The mission from day one has been to design, build, restore, and support masterwork instruments that will transcend for new generations.

**PRESBYTERY IN BRIEF
APRIL 25, 2017**

This gathering of 213 Presbyterians in Montreat was a time of real rejoicing. They joyfully celebrated the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper, led by Pat Bacon, Esta Jarrett, and Keith Grogg- with a stirring sermon by Pat Bacon, who reminded us that "Now is always the right time to do the right thing."

Two outstanding seminarians with rich backgrounds - Andrew Bowman from the Black Mountain congregation, and Rebecca Heilman from the Waldensian congregation - were enthusiastically enrolled as Candidates for the Ministry of Word and Sacrament. (They were charged by Margaret Torrence and Feild Russell, and prayed for by Glenn Bannerman and Willie Pascal.) Afterwards, one commissioner remarked "Our church is in good hands with new ministers like these."

Our Associate Presbyter Billy Robinson was officially commissioned and "prayed in" by his wife (nice planning!) Mary Katherine Robinson.

After a good explanation by Stated Clerk Cam Murchison, the Presbytery overwhelmingly approved the revised Directory for Worship, and also adopted an amendment to that Directory concerning "Access to the Lord's Table" that included these guidelines: *All who come to the table are offered the bread and*

the cup, regardless of their age or understanding. If some of those who come have not yet been baptized, an invitation to baptismal preparation and baptism should be graciously extended.

Dick Larson gave a (nearly) final report on the Building HOPE Campaign, which has garnered \$1.8 million (80% of the target goal) for four essential ministries of our Presbytery - Malawi, Camp Grier, Guatemala, and Vital Churches - all of which are already receiving funds for their enhanced services - and details of which were also given in the full report of our fine General Presbyter, Bobbi White.

The Presbytery welcomed four new ministers: Bryan Hovey (from our sister communion, the United Church of Christ), Carol Hovis, Keith Morrison, and Kathryn Cameron, who will pastor the continuing First Church of Hendersonville.

A warm "welcome back" was given to Mission Co-workers Gary and Marlene Van Brocklin, who related stories of their work in South Asia and other areas of the PC(USA) mission field.

Mimi Michael and Carole Ball reported on the good work of the Guatemala Partnership.

The Presbytery unanimously approved a property settlement with the First Presbyterian Church Hendersonville, and those who want to join the Evangelical Presbyterian denomination. (On April 26, 2017, both congregations unanimously approved the property settlement.) Sincere thanks were given to the Administrative Commission, chaired by Bob Forsythe, that has long labored to bring reconciliation to a troubled situation. Looking to the future, Presbytery established another commission to work pastorally with very small congregations that want to gracefully end their ministry.

Marcia Shoop pastorally offered our intercessions to God, that included Kevin Frederick, who was undergoing a heart operation, and prayers for all the Presbyterian congregations in Hendersonville.

Moderator Susan Denne and Vice-Moderator Melvin Meares skillfully led us through a full, but fruitful, agenda in the Montreat Conference Center, where all were warmly welcomed by its President, Richard DuBose. To God Alone be the Glory!

FROM PRESBYTERY**



The Presbytery Hunger Committee recently awarded \$31,750 from the active **Nickel-a-Meal** fund to support five regional hunger relief projects within the bounds of our Presbytery and one program which is part of our Presbytery's international mission. They are:

1) A summer nutritional feeding program, "Snack Sack," endorsed by Reems Creek – Beech Presbyterian Church;

2) A seven days a week feeding program, "The Community Kitchen," endorsed by Canton Presbyterian Church;

3) A community supported needs assistance program, "Swannanoa Valley Community Ministry," endorsed by Montreat Presbyterian Church;

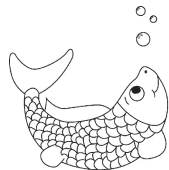
4) A county wide assistance program, "Reaching Avery Ministry," endorsed by Banner Elk Presbyterian Church;

5) A program which works with the homeless and recently released inmates, "Haywood Pathways Center," endorsed by Waynesville Presbyterian Church;

6) The feeding ministry of Nkhoma Hospital in Malawi, Africa.
