## Dear Members and Friends:

Our Member Care Committee at Shelby Presbyterian Church is planning a new initiative that will provide yet another way that our members can serve and be served in Christ's name. The plan is to establish a directory of church members who want to share their time, skills, and services to benefit others in our church family. These are people who are willing to be called upon when they may be of assistance. For example, a member may need a ride to church or to pick up a prescription. Another may appreciate help with a small yard project or home repair. Someone else may need help with a home computer or phone. Still another may appreciate having someone willing to read to them.

The first step is gathering names of members who are willing to be called upon. At our Member Care meeting we have already begun compiling a list. If you are willing and able to help, please call or send an email to our Member Care Committee in care of the church office (704-487-8503 or [info@shelbypres.org](mailto:info@shelbypres.org)). Let us know of your willingness to be called upon and how you would like to help. Also, tell us the best way to contact you when someone is asking for help. For most people this would be a voice mail message, a text, or an email.

The two major areas we have identified are Share-A-Ride (providing rides to church or in town) and Helping Hands (providing assistance with a basic home repair or small yard project). Are there other

ways we can help that we may not yet have identified? Also, let us know if you have other suggestions about how we can make this ministry as helpful and as practical as possible. Look for more information about this Member Care Committee initiative in future newsletters.

On another note, if you were in morning worship on June 18, you heard John Auten speak about the importance of Stephen Ministry for our congregation and about plans for equipping and commissioning a new class of Stephen Ministers this fall. Only yesterday I was talking with one of our Stephen Ministers who told me that Stephen Ministry is one of the most rewarding things he has ever done.

Stephen Ministers, as you may know, are church members who make themselves available to listen, to pray, and to be a Christian friend to a person who is going through a difficult time in their lives. Stephen Ministers commit to fifty hours of training and continued supervision in order to prepare for this ministry of caring. Please give prayerful consideration to whether God may be calling you to this important work. Also, do not hesitate to request a Stephen Minister for yourself or to encourage another member to ask about a Stephen Minister in a time of need.

### **YOUTH DIRECTOR**

We are pleased to announce the hiring of Sydney Davis as our new part-time Youth Director. Sydney will begin her employment with SPC on Sunday, August 13. In addition to active involvement in our youth group meetings, her responsibilities will include building relationships with our middle and high school youth through Sunday morning worship and Sunday School and Wednesday evening activities. In August, Sydney will begin her senior year at Gardner-Webb University, majoring in Chemistry, Math and Education. Her background includes employment as a general counselor and Senior Staff member at Lutheridge, Arden, NC. She has also served as an intern Youth Director at Trinity Lutheran Church, her home church in Vale, NC. She is a graduate of South Caldwell High School where she was a member of the soccer team, cross country team, and band. She was named Caldwell County Female Runner of the Year. She also earned the USMC Distinguished Athlete Award. At GWU, Sydney is a scholarship athlete on the cross country and track teams. She is also a scholar athlete, maintaining a 3.88 GPA. Sydney serves as a women's ministry small group co-leader, a chemistry lab teaching assistant, and a botany tutor. At Trinity Lutheran, Sydney has served as a Sunday School leader, Vacation Bible School leader and coordinator, and was a participant in the Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary Bishop's School. Sydney comes to us with wonderful recommendations from all who have had the privilege to work with her. A welcome event for Sydney will be announced at a later date.

### **PART-TIME YOUTH DIRECTOR EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT**

This agreement confirms that Shelby Presbyterian Church has offered employment as Part-Time Youth Director to Sydney Grace Davis who has accepted these terms and has agreed to serve in this position beginning August 13, 2017.

### **DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES**

The Shelby Presbyterian Church Part-Time Youth Director is to be an enthusiastic, creative, caring, Christ-centered person who loves working with young people. The Youth Ministry serves grades 6-12. This position requires a person with experience working with youth and is based on the Child-Youth Protection Policy. This person must be at least 21 years old, provide references, and pass a background check.

The Part-Time Youth Director is to work on average 20 hours per week (Sunday morning and evening), Wednesday evenings, and other times based on youth activities.

The Part-Time Youth Director will have the full support of the Pastor and the Youth Ministry Committee and will report to the Pastor/Head of Staff.

1. Attend monthly youth ministry committee meetings.
2. Plan, oversee and participate in a Christ-centered youth ministry program (grades 6-12).
3. Work in partnership with youth groups and youth leaders to plan, implement and participate in weekly Sunday night youth programs.
4. Be involved with Sunday School – attend MS and HS Sunday School. Serve as part of the teaching team on a rotational basis for the MS and HS Sunday School classes.
5. Attend 8:30 and 11:00 Sunday worship services and participate in worship leadership occasionally as arranged in consultation with the pastor.
6. Encourage youth to regularly participate in the life of the church and to grow in their love and faith in Christ.
7. Provide energy, excitement and dedication to the Youth of SPC.
8. Utilize social media in a positive and responsible manner to engage and inform youth, congregation and community about events at the church.
9. Attend Wednesday night suppers and programs. Invite and encourage youth to attend.

**MAY 16, 2017**

The Session of Shelby Presbyterian Church met on Tuesday, May 16, 2017 at 6:30 in Ellis Hall. Present were Luke Harkey, Pastor and Moderator; Elders: Doug Boyette, Acting Clerk of Session; Ellen Fletcher, Acting Vice Clerk; Margie McSwain; Kathy Wilson; Sherry Young; Brock Taylor; Jill Venable; Nancy Blackley; Jeff Hamilton; Robin Holland; Anne Langley; Lloyd Williams Jr.; Paul Woodard; Agaat Den Hertog. Joe Ogburn was excused.

Rev. Luke Harkey called the meeting to order and opened with prayer. Jill Venable lit the Christ Candle. Sherry Young led in the singing of a hymn. Luke Harkey led the reading of the Affirmation of Faith and in repeating of Shelby Presbyterian Church's vision: **Growing . . . Praising . . . Serving Growing as disciples and serving the world's needs for the Glory of God.**

### COMMUNICATIONS

Acting Clerk of Session, Doug Boyette:  
•Reported that Shelby Presbyterian Church records had been reviewed with Presbytery and that they were 100% complete and accepted. •Gave a synopsis of the Presbytery Meeting on April 25, 2017 attended by Rev. Luke Harkey, Joe Ogburn, and Doug Boyette.

Co-Chair Diaconate, Laura Carter, reported that:  
•Diaconate met in May. •Deacons were reminded to send letters to neighborhood groups. •Deacons were reminded to stay in touch with their neighborhood group Elder.

Head of Staff, Luke Harkey: •Gave further details of April 25, 2017 Presbytery meeting concerning changes in access to the Lord's Table and a revision of the Directory for Worship. •Reported that security doors have been installed in downstairs hallway of Sunday School/Rainbow classrooms.

### COMMITTEES

Fellowship Chair, Kathy Wilson: •Reviewed with the Session the responsibilities of the Fellowship Committee. •Encouraged Elders to attend

Wednesday Night suppers. •Reported that the committee is considering a game night in August and perhaps a movie night during the summer. •Reported that the committee is evaluating the cost of Wednesday Night suppers. •At present, the cost of the meals exceeds what is being paid by church members. •Reported that coffee and donuts will not be served Sunday mornings in the summer; however, lemonade and cookies will be served following worship. •Requested that the committee be notified if there is a need for some sort of church reception.

Finance Chair, Jill Venable: •Reported that the Finance Committee had received approval of a grant from the Dover Foundation for the repair of lights and windows on the church building. •Moved that the Presbytery be notified that Shelby Presbyterian Church has no current intentions of replacing the Associate Pastor; therefore, we do not feel it necessary to pay the vacancy dues to the Board of Pensions to hold the position. Motion carried.

Nominating Committee Chair, Doug Boyette: •Reported that the committee had discussed whether the Nominating Committee would be assigned the task of filling positions on church committees. It was the conclusion of the Nominating Committee that the committee not initiate this policy. The committee members felt that the Stewardship Committee could somehow canvas church members to determine which committees church members might be willing to and interested in serving. John Auten and Anne Langley agreed to help with seeking members for committees.
