Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

**We live in a rapidly changing world.** The free exchange of ideas and information has drastically accelerated changes to our institutions, our habits, and our comfort levels. Many of these changes have been good, but some have really shaken us up.

Jesus said that "in this world you have trouble, but fear not, for I have overcome the world (John 16:33b)." In the world in which Jesus said this, ideas were spreading faster than ever. While the oppressive Roman military persecuted many, it also made roads safer to travel on than ever before. This spread ideas from every province back to Rome and out again, thus changing the empire quickly and drastically, leading to the spread of the good news amid the persecution.

Rapid cultural change allowed Christianity to thrive, and in the aftermath of the printing press, the rapid change that instigated many wars, also brought much-needed reforms of the Church and technological progress. Today, we are living in another era of rapid change, as electronic media, beginning with radio, then television, and now the internet, has spread ideas and caused trouble.

When I compare the world in which I live compared to what it was before, and what it will be for my children, I get overwhelmed, but find my **peace comes from knowing** Jesus has already overcome the world.

Knowing this, it is incumbent on us to come together and interpret the world through God's Word. The printing press and the Reformation put Scripture in the hands of common people, which is good. However, **if we are to** <u>interpret our world through</u> <u>Scripture</u>, we must be humble and listen to each other so that we might be changed into Christ's image, who humbly shared in our life. When we interpret Scripture alone, or with only one perspective, we risk arrogantly interpreting Scripture through the world, a method which then instead changes Christ into our image.

The church is at its best when it seeks unity in diversity, and not uniformity. This means listening to different viewpoints, be it from the pulpit, in the Sunday School classroom, or in what we read and other media we consume. A world of all liberals or all conservatives becomes the playground of extremists. However, by welcoming ideas that we might not otherwise hear, we grow by trusting Jesus is in control.

My goal is to share the pulpit regularly and I encourage you to participate in Sunday School. It is good to hear more voices from our congregation and for all of us to be vulnerable enough to share our thoughts and listen to others without judgement in Sunday School, after church, and in our everyday life. **May our mutual sharing allow us to be challenged and help us to further transform us into the image of Christ.**


You may think your young people could care less about what you have to say, but current research suggests that the most important influence shaping the religious and spiritual lives of children and youth is their parents. Not only are they listening, but more importantly, they are watching you closely and modeling their lives after you. Whether you believe it or not, parents are the biggest influence in their teens' life. *Friends* influence everyday behavior

**Parents** influence their child's basic values

Parental factors that make a significant difference in promoting faith in children and youth include:

- 1. Parents' personal faith and practice
- 2. Parent modeling and teaching a religious faith
- 3. Parent involvement in church life and Sunday worship

It is critically important we are authentic examples of what we claim to believe. Our authenticity includes faithful living as well as sharing with our children our struggles and failings. It's hard. We want our children to think we are perfect and we like to think our children are perfect. BUT we are not. We all miss the mark. Talk about it with your children and help them to understand how important it is to ask for forgiveness. We will raise better adults if we, as parents, "practice what we preach" OR "walk the talk."
