Starting in October, children in 1<sup>st</sup>- 5<sup>th</sup> grades are invited to sign up and join our organist, Emily Monroe, on the organ bench during part of our church service.

Buddies on the Bench is a special chance for our youngest members to get a behind-the-scenes look at the majestic instrument that fills our sanctuary with beautiful music. Each Sunday, children who sign up will have the opportunity to:

- **Observe**: Watch firsthand how the organist creates the rich, dynamic sounds that enhance our worship experience.
- **Learn**: Discover the different parts of the organ and how they work together to produce music.
- **Participate**: Explore simple, hands-on experiences with guidance from our organist, making the learning experience both fun and memorable.

This program not only aims to foster an appreciation for church music but also to make our worship services more engaging and interactive for our younger generation.



#### **How to Sign Up:**

- **Registration**: Sign-up with QR code. Children can be registered on a weekly basis, so there's no need for a long term commitment—just pick a Sunday that works best for you!
- **Age Groups**: 1<sup>st</sup>- 5<sup>th</sup> grades. Our organist will tailor the experience to be age-appropriate and engaging for each participant.
- **Time Slot**: Participants will join the organist for a portion of the service before the Children's Moment and then return to sit with their family.

We encourage all families to consider this wonderful opportunity for their children. It's a fantastic way to deepen their connection to our church's music ministry and to experience the joy of creating worshipful sound.
