

Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

It's October and election season is in full swing, so here's a reminder: **HOW we** vote is important, especially when others know we claim to follow Christ.

The importance of "HOW" we vote is not the candidates we choose. Nor is it the method we use to vote – by mail, early, or at the polls. What matters about "HOW" we vote is the way in which we participate in or opt out of politics.

How we participate in this election season is seen by our children, our extended families, our peers, total strangers, and even those we perceive as our enemies. When they see us participating in politics, will they see the love of God in Christ reflected in us? Jesus said, "Let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven."

Will others see God's grace, if we condemn candidates and judge supporters? Consider instead how we can exemplify God's grace in praying for the good of those whom we disagree with, and choosing to love them, as hard as that can be.

Will others know God's truth, if we spread misinformation? Consider instead how we want others to trust the truth of Jesus when we proclaim it, so we had best not squander our credibility for worldly victories and instead stop the spread of misinformation.

Will others recognize anything different or truly holy in us, if we profess faith but make excuses for our sins and those of people we support? Consider instead that we are holy when we forgive others and confess our own sin, turning to God who is in control.

This is hard. We are bombarded by messages that say we need science, economics, and politics to save us. Yet no breakthrough, system, or candidate can save. **Jesus is our Savior. He loves us and calls us to love God, our neighbors, and even our enemies.** Science, economics, and politics are good, but they are just tools for us to use in our calling.

Following Christ means we join in his work to reconcile all things through him, which includes addressing injustice, suffering, and hurt in this world. Following Christ means we live into this calling with humility, gentleness, patience, and love, seeking unity in the bond of the Spirit. Following Christ means that in all things we trust in His grace, which is never earned – especially not by our vote.

> understanding and respect. This strengthens the fabric of our church community, making it more inclusive and supportive.


Our retreat was a time for the older generation to pass down wisdom, stories, and traditions to the younger members. Young people gain a



Would you write a short devotional and/or prayer (just a paragraph or two) reflecting on one person in the nativity and the meaning of their name?





## SPC Reports & Minutes

#### **SESSION MINUTES AUGUST 20, 2024**

<u>Diaconate Report:</u> Michelle Moser reported usher schedule, currently created by Miranda, has some difficulties for some Deacons. Michelle will work with Miranda on next year's schedule. Deacons still interested in getting video & sound hooked up for narthex so they can follow service. Also, church Ice Cream social was held in Ellis Hall due to weather concerns. It was a big success. Many thanks to the Deacons involved for their good work.

<u>Clerk's Report</u> -Larry reported on "Thank you" note (posted on bulletin board beside officer mailboxes) from Garrett and Caroline Briggs to whole church for welcoming them so warmly during the 18 months they lived here while Garrett completed nursing school at GWU. Also, we received annual report letter from Habitat for Humanity thanking us for financial support and volunteer help on 5-church "church build". Also, there is currently a drive to organize another 5-church build, following the success of the first one.

<u>Pastor's Report:</u> Pastor Drew reported that a busy September is fast approaching, and he commented on how the church has become more cohesive and outreach-focused during his 3 years here.

<u>Finance Committee</u> -Richard reported total revenue for July was \$6000 below budget for the period, and stands at \$62,194 below budget for the year. Actual total revenue versus total expense for year to date shows a revenue deficit of \$77,094, a 7% increase over June figures.

<u>Member Life Committee</u>—Recommended that we accept the transfer of church membership of Doug and Janet Eury from Central United Methodist Church in Spencer, NC. Unanimously approved.

<u>Personnel Committee</u> Laura reported that Personnel has hired Scott Bradford as Sexton to work part-time, 9am to 1pm Monday through Friday. He will start tomorrow, August 21. Personnel also has hired 2 nursery workers, Heather Johnson and Maggie Hohne. Personnel also recommended hiring of a Ministry Intern, ideally from GWU, to assist Carol Ann 15 hours per week at \$15/hour. Jim McConnell will assist in evaluating prospects. Bruce Moser and Emily Monroe will also be auditioning GWU music students for position of Choral Scholar, to practice and perform with the choir. Stipend will be \$25 per service. Both recommendations approved unanimously.

<u>Property Committee</u> – Bill reported that the new back door (by kitchen) is to be installed Wednesday, August 21. 96 fluorescent fixtures in Ellis Hall have been converted to LEDs. Second floor in educational building has little to no insulation overhead, leading to significant variation in temperatures in those rooms, as well as higher heating/cooling bills. Bill will obtain bids from insulation installers for next meeting.

<u>Music and Worship</u>—Steve reported M & W recommended moving Communion from Christmas Eve service to December 22 service. After discussion, this was unanimously approved. M & W also recommended approval of wedding of Meredith Teddy and Artem Moskalenko Saturday August 24, 2024, in the chapel. This was unanimously approved. Finally, M & W recommended approval of Baptism of Max Coker, son of Tabatha Coker, on Sunday, September 8. This was unanimously approved.

Old Business - None

**New Business** – Request from Stephanie and Alex Martin to have Baptism of Eliza Martin on Sunday August 25, 2024. Motion by Larry, second by Richard, unanimously approved.

Drew reported on the sale of the former John Knox property to Family Worship Center, the congregation that has been renting it from Presbytery. It is unclear what will be the outcome of the final John Knox Session request that 10% of any proceeds received by Presbytery be donated to Shelby Presbyterian Food Ministry

Action Items: Bill will get insulation estimates to Finance Committee for consideration.

<u>Closing</u> - Motion to adjourn by John, second by Bill, unanimously passed. Tom dismissed us with prayer.
