A healthy church is not measured by attendance or finance, but the faithfulness of its members to growing closer to God, to one another, and to their community. **I am so** grateful for your faithfulness at SPC. I am continually thankful for how many of you come in person or join worship online, not because attendance numbers matter, but because in doing so, **it is evident that you desire to participate in worship to grow closer to God.** I can gauge this in the feedback many of you give, as well as the growing enthusiasm of our choir and your response to the work they and all our musicians put into their offering each week.

Lastly, I am grateful for your faithful response to needs. You have put so much time and energy into the Habitat for Humanity Church Partnership Build, and you have given generously to fund it. Your faithfulness is also seen in your overwhelming response to the Rainbow Christmas in July, your support for 5 cents-a-meal and the Emergency Assistance fund, the many volunteers in Food Ministry, and your dedication to Turning Point Academy. Thank you!

What a joy it is to walk in ministry alongside such a faithful church and my prayer for us is that we will grow in our faithful response to the gospel, strengthening our bonds with God, with one another, and with our community.


