

Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

What is the goal of a church? What is a successful church?

Roughly 88,553,289 books are marketed to pastors about growing a church. Don't hold me to the number, but it's overwhelming. These books sell the supposedly best strategies to make a church grow. They point to huge impersonal mega-church congregations as the goal, with every seat filled, budgets to support a huge staff, and amazing buildings as the proof of God's blessing.

Early on, I read a lot of these books. I started to buy into it. I shared some of the strategies with the churches I served. Yet, it was not until I got to Shelby that I encountered a church that truly was growing, and we haven't used one strategy.

The truth is that the goal of a church is not increased attendance and giving. **The goal is <u>faithfulness</u>** – **People hearing and responding to God's call in the community where it is planted.** You have been a needed reminder to me that no pastor, church, or strategy does anything without the Holy Spirit.

You have been faithful as a community to pray, to serve, to give, to put others first, and to be involved in your community in numerous ways. When a church is faithful, being a church is about more than getting individual souls in church and heaven. It's about answering our prayer of, "Thy Kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven," through actions led by the Holy Spirit.

To that end, when our denomination said <u>every church</u> is required to have an "Anti-Racism" policy, the Personnel Committee opted to do more than put platitudes on paper to meet this requirement. We decided to instead consider what it might mean for SPC to reflect God's will for all nations to share in the new creation.

This is the back story for why we started the "Building a Multiethnic Church," book study. We've had four sessions so far, and the discussion has been fruitful, as we consider how our generally financially stable, well-educated members of mostly European ancestry might relate to our neighbors who don't share all of these traits.

The goal of this study is to write a biblically sound policy with your input. There is no pre-determined 'strategy,' but only a desire to be faithful to the gospel by helping us understand how we might, as a church, better reveal the kingdom in Shelby and Cleveland County.

<u>Upcoming studies are at 6 pm on March 13, March 20, April 17, and April 24, with childcare provided.</u>

It is our hope that you will come, whether you have done the reading or not, and participate in this biblical book study.

Have you ever taught a child to hold their fingers inside their hands and say the rhyme, "here is the church, here is the steeple, open the doors and see all the people?" - •When poverty and violence cause hunger and people join together to respond to the need and address its root causes, **this is church.**
- •When injustice falls on those who are vulnerable and people join hands with one another and lift their voices against the interests of power, *this is church*.

The church is the Holy Spirit's transforming power emanating into the world sharing the compassion, justice, love, and peace of Christ. Presbyterians join the movement of the Spirit into every corner of the Earth – and in this season, through our church–wide **One Great Hour of Sharing**.



SPC Reports & Minutes

SESSION MINUTES JANUARY 16, 2024

Communications

Prior to Clerk's Report – On motion by Bill and second by Susan, vote to elect Larry Wilson as Clerk and Tom Martin as Vice–Clerk for year of 2024 was passed unanimously. Also, on motion by Steve and second by Mystie, vote to give a Diaconate Representative voice at all 2024 Session meetings was passed unanimously.

<u>Clerk's Report</u> - There will be a congregational meeting Sunday January 21 to elect two at-large members of the Nominating Committee for two-year terms, and to approve the terms of call for Pastor Drew.

<u>Pastor's Report</u> – Minutes of Session meeting of December 12, 2023 were unanimously approved on motion of Laura and second by Bill.

On motion by John and second by Richard and Carolyn J, Mystie Brotherton will be added to the Nominating Committee.

Finance Committee – Richard reported Recommendation from Finance to combine categories of "unpledged" and "loose" offerings, as well as approval of new budget amounts, revised in light of increased pledges received through January 4. On motion by Mystie and second by Steve, the approved budget in amount of \$678,528 with above changes was unanimously approved.

The \$50,000 challenge grant from Cornerstone Fund for Habitat for Humanity has been matched by funds raised by SPC, Eastside Baptist, St. Mary's Catholic, Ryburn Presbyterian, and New Creation Christian Center, and the work continues on the 3 houses under construction.

2023 ended \$19,800 over budget—this includes a large deposit paid to Montreat in anticipation of our 2024 Montreat weekend.

<u>Property Committee</u> – Bill reported the pump problem with main furnace has been repaired. Meeting set for 1/17/24 with Shelby Heating and Air to begin work on replacing heat/air units in youth rooms and conference and parlor rooms.

Plans to update two restrooms outside kitchen door to "Family" restrooms with changing stations and locking doors. Church workdays are set to occur on every fifth Saturday (June 29, August 31, November 30), though these dates may change given the holiday weekends on which they land.

Water continues to be an issue in basement choir room. Bill located one "entry point" and cleaned/caulked it. Will continue to monitor.

<u>Old Business</u> – Community refrigerator getting lots of use and people are very appreciative of the help. The trash can needs to be checked regularly.

New Business - None

Closing - Motion to adjourn by John, seconded by Steve, closed with prayer by Larry.

CONGREGATIONAL MINUTES JANUARY 21, 2024

At the close of the 10:00 a.m. Worship Service, Pastor Drew called the congregational meeting to Order and opened with prayer.

Clerk of Session Larry Wilson determined that a quorum was present for the meeting.

Richard Dedmon, Chair of Finance Committee, presented the 2024 Budget, which had been approved by session at its January 16, 2024 meeting, to the congregation. There were no questions.

Clerk then recognized Laura Lampley, Chair of Nominating Committee. Laura thanked the outgoing members of the committee, Amy Goforth, David Steeves, and Lori Wehmueller (Diaconate representative) for their service. The floor was opened for nominations for two new at-large members. Robin Holland and Brett Niblack were nominated. There being no further nominations, upon motion and second, the nominations were closed. Then upon motion and second to elect the two nominees, the election was unanimous.

Clerk then excused Pastor Drew from the meeting and presented the Terms of Call for the Pastor to the congregation. There being no questions, upon motion and second, the vote to approve the Terms of Call was unanimous.

Pastor Drew was then invited to return to the sanctuary and close the meeting with prayer.
