Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

You matter. Wherever you are in life, you are part of God’s plan, and how you live, what you do, and how you do it, makes an impact now and eternally.

In our modern culture, there is an increasing emphasis on dividing humanity into two groups – materialists and spiritualists. The materialist sees humanity as a composite of atoms, the result of a process, and finite – all that matters is right now. The spiritualist sees humanity as a soul trapped in a mortal body, destined to greater things, and eternal – all that matters is after death.

In scripture, we see a rejection of both the materialist and the spiritualist. In the beginning, God made the world and the entire universe and said it was “good.” The material world is important. You see, God has not abandoned us to our mortal state with only a set of principles to get our souls to heaven. No. We pray in the Lord’s Prayer, that God’s “will be done on earth, as it is in heaven” and in the creeds, we confess the resurrection. **Our calling is not to escape the world, but reflect God’s image and love into it, to share in the redemption of the world.**

I hope you can make it to Montreat this year. I am also grateful for all that this church has done and continues to do to participate in the work of Christ in the world. **You matter, and what you do on the foundation of Jesus Christ will be tested and preserved in eternity.**

From the Desk of Carol Ann

When I was in college, driving back to Boone was often a journey filled with anticipation and anxiety. On those drives, there was a particular church that always managed to capture my attention with its witty and thought-provoking marquee sayings. One that always brought a chuckle was, "Stop, drop, and roll won't work in hell!" But amidst the humor, there was one message that resonated deeply and has stayed with me for over 30 years: **"Faith ends where worry begins."**

This simple yet profound statement struck a chord, especially during a time when exams and academic pressures were at the forefront of my mind. It was a reminder that faith and worry cannot coexist; where one thrives, the other cannot. During those stressful times, I needed to hear that message, and today, perhaps more than ever, I find its wisdom essential.

Life is filled with uncertainties, and it's easy to let worry creep in and take hold of our thoughts. Whether it's concerns about health, family, work, or the state of the world, worry can become a constant companion if we let it. Yet, the essence of faith is to trust in God, even when we cannot see the way forward.

Matthew 6:34 encourages us with these words: "Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own." This verse reminds us that worry is not only unproductive but also unnecessary when we place our trust in God. The message from that church marquee continues to guide me, urging me to choose faith over worry. When worry begins to cloud my mind, I am reminded to turn to prayer, to seek comfort in God's promises, and to find peace in knowing that God cares for me.

Matthew 6:25-26 encourages us with these words: "Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothes? Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they?" God wants us to live in the present and rely on His grace for today.

When worry begins to cloud my mind, and it does often.... I am reminded to turn to prayer, to seek comfort in God's promises, and to find peace in knowing that God is with me. God's presence provides a sanctuary of calm amidst the storms of life.

As a community, let us support each other in this journey of faith. Let's remind one another of the power of trusting in God and encourage each other to let go of worries that burden our hearts. Together, we can cultivate a faith that stands strong against the trials of life.

So, next time worry starts to take over, remember that **faith ends where worry begins**. Trust in God's love and care, and let your faith be the light that dispels the darkness of worry.

SESSION MINUTES APRIL 16, 2024

Order of the Day: Examination of confirmands:

Drew recognized confirmands Ian Haig, Nate Haig, and Amelia Pruitt. Unable to attend were Khia Hickman and Jasmine Martin. All have been through the confirmation classes, and Session members reviewed their Statements of Faith, and had few questions for the students. After Motion by Steve and second by Bill, the confirmands were unanimously confirmed and accepted into the church pending their presentation to the congregation, and Baptism of Ian, Nate, and Jasmine, on May 19.

Communications

Clerk's Report - Letter received from Presbytery acknowledging the receipt of SPC Statistical Report for 2023.
