It's summer at Rainbow! We will have our summer program through the months of June and July. All of the children are looking forward to learning about nature, taking fun field trips, and creating things with their friends.


The 2022/2023 school year is approaching fast, and a lot of our classes are already full! We are so blessed to have such wonderful families and children to attend our program.

#### **Communications**

- <u>John Brotherton</u> discussed 2 Overtures that will be considered at the upcoming Presbytery meeting later in the month and requested someone volunteer to be our second delegate to the meeting. A request from our Funeral Commission for holding a funeral service for Joseph Miller on May 7 was presented and approved.
- The Diaconate report was presented and identified that we will host missionaries Steve & Alene Burgert on Wednesday night May 18.
- <u>Drew Mangione</u> discussed ongoing planning for a Service of Installation later this summer. A vote to hold the service in our sanctuary will occur when a date is proposed.

#### **Committee Reports**

- <u>Finance Committee</u> Scoot Dixon discussed a meeting held with the officers from Bank of OZK for an investment review of our funds. Information sharing should result in improving opportunities for better returns on invested funds. Budget results for the first quarter 2022 were very good with revenues above budget and exceeding expenses for the time period. A review of our property insurance coverage has been completed and our coverage has been updated for the first time in several years. The committee plans to evaluate coverage approximately every 3 years.
- <u>Member Life</u> Fred Blackley reported that a luncheon for all new members and sponsors from the past year is planned for May 1. We expect to have 100 attendees.
- <u>Nominating</u> Larry Wilson reported that the process of identifying the next class of officers for presentation to the congregation is underway and progressing well.
- <u>Personnel Committee</u> Darlene Gravett reported that Erin Borders will begin work as our Bookkeeper on April 25 in a contract capacity rather than as a church employee. A search for someone to fill the Sexton role is also continuing with interviews planned.

#### **Old and New Business**

- Gifts have been received by the Food Ministry with current funds in excess of \$35,000. Several needs have been identified for possible use of some of these funds for improvements in facilities used by the ministry. Evaluation of options is underway. Recognition of contributions to the ministry is being considered.
- The registration deadline for our SPC Family Reunion in Montreat is approaching with May 15 being the last Sunday to register and submit a deposit.

## SESSION MINUTES MAY 17, 2022

#### **Communications**

- <u>John Brotherton</u> welcomed all officers who could be present and expressed thanks for everyone's commitment to serving and fulfilling our roles as officers in our church. A request was made to ratify action from our Funeral Commission for approval to hold the funeral service for Jane McBrayer in the Chapel on April 29. The request was presented and approved unanimously. A request was also made for 2 Elders to be our commissioners to the July 30 Presbytery Meeting to be held virtually via Zoom. There were no volunteers at this time, but Ben Brooks indicated he may be able to attend.
- <u>Drew Mangione</u> reminded everyone that all building use requests should be coordinated through our church office administrator in order to avoid conflicts with overlapping use among groups. Drew also provided an update from the April 26 Presbytery Meeting. This was the first in-person Presbytery meeting since January 2020. Among the actions taken at the meeting was approval to rename the '5-cents-a-meal' offering to 'Daily Change'. Additionally, there were two Overtures presented from other presbyteries and both were affirmed for consideration at the General Assembly.
- <u>Elizabeth Schweppe</u> presented an update from the Diaconate with thanks to all Deacons, ushers, and other volunteers for several events including Red Cross Blood Drives, Luncheons, Wednesday Night programs, etc.
- <u>Drew Mangione</u> initiated an update from Session and requested Darlene Gravett to update all on our personnel status. Darlene was elated to report that we are now fully staffed! Marie Jackson started work on May 16 as our Sexton, Erin Borders has started work as our Bookkeeper, and Sherry Thomas is now serving in our Office Assistant role.

#### **Committee Reports**

- <u>Discipleship Committee</u> Cheryl Sisk listed many activities in progress with planning for the Montreat retreat in September, a June 11 Dessert Auction, and trips for Youth groups over the summer. The committee has evaluated requests to potentially adjust worship time on Sunday mornings but is not currently pursuing changes for the summer.
- <u>Fellowship Committee</u> Drew discussed how the Wednesday night program with Steve & Alene Burgert is a sort of trial run for resuming regular Wednesday programs.
- <u>Finance Committee</u> Scoot Dixon reported that year-to-date revenues exceed budget while expenses continue to be below budget. A discussion was held on the role of Treasurer and requirements for the role as laid out in the Book of Order. A recommendation to name Erin Borders as our Treasurer through January 2024 was made, discussed, and approved unanimously.
- <u>Member Life</u> Fred Blackley reported on efforts to update and maintain the prayer list. Fred also reported on the successful and enjoyable new member luncheon that was held on May 1 in Ellis Hall.
- <u>Mission & Ministry</u> Drew reported on how funds from 5-Cents a Meal (now Daily Change) is allocated with 3-cents to Presbytery and 2-cents utilized locally to support needs here. Our Food Ministry has received significant funds that are available to fund some improvements. Plans are to fund a freight ramp and other improvements within Harrill House.
- Nominating Drew reported that progress continues to identify a class of nominees.
- Worship & Music Ben Brooks discussed the upcoming schedule for Sunday School and worship activities and programs that are being planned.

#### **Old and New Business**

- Drew confirmed plans for holding his installation service at 4:00 on July 31. A motion to approve was followed by discussion and unanimous approval.
- Due to schedule conflicts, a request was made to reschedule the stated June meeting from June 21 to June 14. A motion to approve was made and approved unanimously.
